

Animal Science Technology – Equine Science Program Riding Video Requirements

As an applicant to the Animal Science Technology – Equine program, you must provide a video demonstrating your riding skills on the horse you intend to bring to the program.

The purpose of the video is to help instructors assess your riding ability and ensure that your horse is suitable for the program's "Learn to Train" curriculum. This process enables us to provide the best opportunities for your success in riding classes.

Skill Level Expectations

To participate successfully in this program, you must demonstrate riding skills at a level higher than those required for basic lessons. A solid foundation in balance and riding proficiency is necessary to engage in training horses effectively.

Video Requirements

The video should be a clear, home-video style recording of you riding your intended program horse through the following maneuvers:

- Mount the horse
- Walk a 50-foot (16-meter) circle in each direction (left and right)
- Trot two 50-foot (16-meter) circles in each direction
- Lope two 50 to 80-foot (16 to 25-meter) circles in each direction
- Stop from a trot
- Trot directly toward the camera for 80 to 100 feet (25 to 30 meters)
- Dismount the horse
- Simple lead change each direction

Videos submitted with horses other than your intended program horse will not be accepted.
